## Folding a tent



After you have dried and swept out your tent: Lay out the tent flat Zip up the windows and doors Lay the fly on top of the tent as evenly as possible and fold the excess fly back on its self so the fly does not exceed the boundries of the tent perimeter



Tie up the guy line runners neatly so they don't get tangled



Look for the doors of the tent and fold each side towards the center. Think of the center of the door being the center of the tent. Bring the outside edges to the center but not overlapping.

Fold it in half one more time. Now you have a long narrow tent that is the width of the tent poles.

Check the tent pole bag. In our district tents there three black poles with the tents. There may be other poles as well.

Check the tent peg bag – there should be 14 tent pegs inside.

Put the poles across the end of the tent.

## Folding a tent



Roll up the tent and remove the air as you go Unroll and re roll it so it will be tighter

Check to see that the number on the tent matches the number on the tarp Fold the tarp so it is the same width as the tent Make sure the tarp is flat. If not, refold it.

Roll the tarp around the tent

Put the tent in the tent bag and cinch up the straps as tight as you can.
